

VILLAGE OF VANSCOY
BYLAW 5-14

A BYLAW TO REGULATE THE OPERATION OF VEHICLES WITHIN THE
VILLAGE

Council of the Village of Vanscoy, in the Province of Saskatchewan, in open meeting, enact as follows:

1. Part I – Interpretation

- a. Administrator means the administrator of the Village of Vanscoy
- b. Angle Parking means the parking of vehicles with the right front wheel drawn up to the curb on the right hand side of the street at a distance of not more than thirty (30) centimeters from such curb; the vehicle to be placed at an angle of 45 degrees with the curb
- c. Curb means the lateral boundaries of a roadway, whether or not marked by curbing
- d. Heavy Vehicles means a motor vehicle with or without a load which alone or with any trailer, semi-trailer or other vehicle being towed, weighs 4.5 tons or more
- e. Lane means a public highway intended primarily to give access to the rear of a property
- f. Loading Zone means that portion of a public highway adjacent to the curb, designated by signs and / or markings for the exclusive use of vehicles loading and unloading passengers or goods
- g. Lug Vehicle means any truck, portable engine having metal spikes, lugs or cleats projecting from the face of the wheels; or having a metal track tread
- h. Parallel Parking means the parking of a vehicle with both right wheels drawn up to the curb on the right hand side of the street, or at a distance of not more than thirty (30) centimeters from such curb
- i. Place of Public Assembly means schools, churches, hockey, skating and curling arenas, dance halls and public assembly halls
- j. Power Turn means to maneuver a vehicle in such a manner as to cause the rear of the vehicle to depart from its ordinary line of progress by the sudden use of acceleration and or braking
- k. Speed Zone means any portion of a street within the Village and identified by a sign erected and maintained at each end, indicating the maximum speed applicable
- l. Street means any street or public highway within the Village, but does not include a provincial highway
- m. U Turn means the turning of a vehicle so as to cause it to proceed in the opposite direction from which it was proceeding immediately prior to the commencement of such a turn
- n. Vehicle means a combination of vehicles and any load on the vehicle or

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Part II – Regulations

1. Stop Streets

The streets as listed in Appendix 1 are designated as stop streets

2. Yield Streets

The streets as listed in Appendix 2 are designated as yield streets

3. Miscellaneous Signs

- a. No person shall, except where authorized by Council, erect upon or immediately adjacent to any street, a sign, marker, signal or light
- b. No person shall deface, damage, destroy or remove any sign erected pursuant to this bylaw

4. Lug Vehicles

- a. No person shall propel, operate or drive any lug vehicle upon any street within the Village without first having obtained a permit in writing authorizing
- b. The administrator is hereby authorized to issue permits in writing, for the conveyance of a lug vehicle over any street

5. Parking

- a. Except as otherwise provided, the parking of vehicles is permitted on all streets in the Village
- b. No person shall park a vehicle on a street, or in a lane so as to obstruct the entrance to a lane or driveway or approach leading to private premises; nor shall a sidewalk be obstructed
- c. A commercial vehicle may be parked in any lane for the purpose of taking on or discharging cargo, provided that no truck or vehicle shall be parked for an extended period of time
- d. Every person parking a vehicle upon a street within the Village where parking is permitted shall parallel park same
- e. Every person parking a vehicle upon the streets listed in Appendix 3 shall angle park same
- f. No person shall park a vehicle in any “No Parking” area as designated in Appendix 4
- g. No person shall park an unregistered vehicle on any street
- h. No person shall park any vehicle in any private parking place or on private property unless he is the owner, occupant, or permit holder of the parking place
- i. No person shall park any commercial vehicle designed for carrying or intended for the carrying of oil, gasoline or other flammable combustible or explosive material within thirty (30) meters from any building in the Village used or intended for use, as a place of dwelling, a hotel or place of public assembly
- j. No person shall park a truck with a manufacturers rated capacity in excess of 5500 kg on any street or avenue except as designated in Appendix 5
- k. No person shall park a boat motor home or RV on any street for

- k. NO PERSON SHALL PARK A BOAT, MOTOR HOME OR RV ON ANY STREET FOR longer than a period of seven days without prior written permission

6. Snowmobiles, All Terrain Vehicles and Dirt Bikes

- a. Under the provisions of Section 21 of the Snowmobile Act, and subject to Subsection (G) it shall be lawful for owners and operators of snowmobiles to use the following streets as an access only to the Village limits:
 - i. Main Street
 - ii. First Avenue
 - iii. Second Avenue
- b. It shall be lawful to operate a snowmobile on any other street only for the purpose of crossing such street
- c. An operator of a snowmobile may not exceed a speed limit of 20 km/hour while using the access routes to the Village limits
- d. No snowmobiles should be operated within the Village limits between the hours of 11pm and 8am
- e. Permission may be given by resolution of council to operate snowmobiles on designated streets for special group events
- f. Subject to Section 15 of the Snowmobile Act, Subsection 2 states “No person shall operate a snowmobile that is required to be registered by this act unless that person:
 - i. Holds a class 1, 2, 3, 4, or 5 Drivers License
 - ii. Is at least 16 years of age and has completed a safety course
 - iii. Is 12 years of age or older but less than 16 years of age and has completed a safety course if that person is:
 - 1. Accompanied on the snowmobile by another person who holds a Class 1, 2, 3, 4, or 5 Drivers License
 - iv. Subject to Section 4 of the All-Terrain Vehicles Act, no person under the age of 16 shall operate an all- terrain vehicle
 - v. Dirt bikes will not be permitted to operate on Village Streets, park areas or within Village limits

7. Speed

- a. Subject to subsection (b), no person shall operate a vehicle in the Village at a speed greater than forty (40) km/hour
- b. No person shall operate a vehicle at a speed greater than twenty-five (25) km/hour in the Speed Zones
- c. The provision of Sections a and b shall not apply to the operators of fire engines or fire department apparatus or to the operators of ambulances where these vehicles are being operated in emergency duty

8. U Turns

- a. No person driving a vehicle shall turn the vehicle so as to proceed in the opposite direction between intersections

9. Weight Restrictions – Truck Routes

- a. No person shall operate a vehicle or combination of vehicles when the combined gross weight of the vehicle with or without a load exceeds 12,000 kg, except where the vehicle is on a designated truck route as listed in Appendix 6

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- b. Subject to Section 1, no person shall operate a vehicle or combination of vehicles when the combined gross weight of the vehicle with or without a load exceeds 35 tons on any street in the Village
- c. Subsections a and b shall not apply to vehicles making deliveries on any street in the Village provided that the operator uses the most direct route from and to the truck route listed in Appendix 6

10. Signs

- a. Council shall cause to be erected and maintained at all stop street listed in Appendix 1, at a distance of approximately three (3) meters from the point of intersection, an appropriate sign containing the word "Stop", so placed as to face traffic approaching the intersection
- b. Council shall cause to be erected and maintained at all yield streets listed in Appendix 2, an appropriate sign containing the word "Yield", so place to face traffic approaching the intersection
- c. Council shall cause to be erected and maintained at all no parking areas as listed in Appendix 4, appropriate signs and or curb markings. Such signs or curb markings shall be visible from that part of the street to which the restriction applies
- d. Council may provide for the erection and maintenance on any street, and at any designated point or points or such signs, as it may deem expedient, for warning, guidance, direction or information thereon

11. Penalties

- a. Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of Subsection 1 and 2 of this bylaw is guilty of an offense or liable upon summary conviction A violator of any section of this bylaw, upon being served with a "Notice of Violation" may, during regular office hours, voluntarily pay the penalty, and upon payment, that person shall not be liable to prosecution of the offense
- b. The "Notice of Violation" shall be in Form 2, Appendix 8 attached to and forming part of this bylaw

12. Impounding

- a. A member of the police force, special constable or other person appointed by Council may remove or cause to be removed any vehicle that is unlawfully placed, left or kept on any street or lane, public parking place, or on Village owned property and to impound or store such vehicles
- b. Where a vehicle has been impounded or stored after it has been removed under subsection (a), it may be retained at a place designated by Council for a period of thirty (30) days from the date of removal unless the cost of removal, impounding, storage and any other cost incurred are sooner paid. Upon payment of the full cost, the vehicle may be released to the owner
- c. Impound Fees shall be a total of \$30 per day
- d. If the cost of removal, impounding and storage are not paid within the

- iii. If the cost of removal, impounding and storage are not paid within the period of thirty (30) days as specified, the Village shall have the right to recover same from the owner of the vehicle by:
 - i. Legal action in a court of competent jurisdiction, or
 - ii. Sale by public auction on publication of notice designating the time and place of sale at least ten (10) days prior to the sale in a newspaper circulating in the Village and on sending such notice by registered mail to the owner at the address appearing on the last registration of the vehicle

13.Repeal

Bylaw 1-99 and any amendments are hereby repealed
